




Stand with Genocide Victims on International Women's Day


It is time to start treating ISIS's genocide as genocide.



Over **3,000** Yazidi women and girls are currently being held as slaves by ISIS.

Yazidi women in ISIS captivity are routinely

- SOLD AS SEX SLAVES**
- RAPED**
- BEATEN**
- IMPREGNATED**
- FORCED TO HAVE ABORTIONS**
- FORCED INTO MARRIAGES**
- FORCED TO CONVERT**



We must demand accountability for these crimes. The arrest and prosecution of ISIS fighters for genocide can help stem recruitment and radicalization. **The time to act is now!**

GJC is fighting for the international community, including the UN, EU and all 147 states that signed the Genocide Convention to:

1. **Recognize** that genocide is happening;
2. Take immediate steps to **prevent further genocide** and **suppress ongoing genocide**, including fulfilling their duty to rescue women and girls who are being held captive;
3. **Punish genocide**, including by supporting prosecutions at the International Criminal Court.
